# Principal's Report

We had our first SRC (Student Representative Council) meeting this week. We have over 30 members, which is fantastic. More members are welcome; they just need to see SRC President Felicity Conway, Secretary Sophie Bowe or Mr Lyttle to join. All members are charged with the role of seeking ideas from and listening to their peers and bringing this to SRC, to aid the continual improvement of our College.

School Council approved our AIP (Annual Implementation Plan) on Monday night. Increasing the amount of student voice is a highlight in our plan. Over the next two weeks, students will be giving each of their teachers' feedback through a survey. We will repeat this survey each term and use it to improve the learning experience for our students. Another key focus in our AIP, as with the rest of the State, is to improve our students' literacy. Being literate is essential to enable a person to access the learning in every subject. Kate Mullins is our Literacy Leader. Currently she is leading work around the writing process, at the moment, in particular the key skills around editing.

Our AIP will be available on our website next week through the "About" and "Strategic Planning" menus.


Good luck to our Swimming team at Southern Ranges on Monday. All members of the team receive a \$5 Café voucher to acknowledge their success in participating at this level. In addition, due to a wonderful input from our students, each team member will receive 5 points for their House and we will double both points and café vouchers for students who go through to the next level.

Energy drinks and large bottles of soft drink are not appropriate at school due to the negative effect sugar and caffeine have on student health and are therefore confiscated if brought here. This is part of encouraging our students to make healthy choices.
