



This week we were fortunate to have Toshi from Nexus Arts visit us to run taiko drumming workshops for our Japanese students. There were five workshops allowing each of the four Japanese classes the opportunity to try their hand at taiko. The fifth workshop was open to students in Years 9 and 10 who had previously studied Japanese, or Music students with an interest in drumming. Toshi's workshops were very hands on. After an introduction to taiko and taiko specific vocabulary, students had the opportunity to play the large, medium and small drums. At the end of each workshop the whole class combined to present a taiko band performance. If you were in Alexandra on Wednesday it is possible you may have hear our drumming in parts of the town. Toshi has played the largest drum in Japan, which is 4 metres in width and can be heard four kilometres away!
