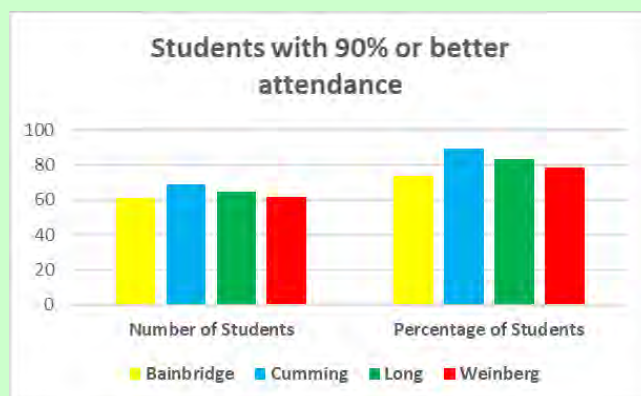

In addition, due to a wonderful input from our students, each team member will receive 5 points for their House and we will double both points and café vouchers for students who go through to the next level.

We are very pleased to have Dr Melinda Evans rejoining our staff, she has replaced Mrs Boliiancu who has taken the year off. Mrs Evans has come back to our staff after recently completing her PhD in Education.

Energy drinks and large bottles of soft drink are not appropriate at school due to the negative effect sugar and caffeine have on student health and are therefore confiscated if brought here. This is part of encouraging our students to make healthy choices.

Every day of learning makes a positive impact. We set 90% attendance as the minimum level to aim for. At this stage of the year, all students who have missed no more than 2 days of school are in this healthy category.
