### ASC Geography Students Excel in National Competition

Earlier this term, many students from Years 7-12 tested their geographical skills and knowledge against students from all around Australia in the 2020 Australian Geography Competition.

It has been a challenging year for schools with the pandemic, so we were delighted to still be able to give students the opportunity to sit the test, with over 65,000 students entering Australia-wide.

We received the results on Tuesday afternoon and were thrilled with students' achievements.

Dante and James scored in the top 2% of Australia, and Emma scored in the top 1% of Australia!

## Principals Report

Well done to Year 11s and accelerating Year 10s, who have completed their end of year exams. They have now started their Year 12 classes in our Head Start program.

It was nice to meet all our future students from St Marys this week in the last of our small group visits. It has been a different transition this year but Bron Howell and our feeder primary schools are doing a good job to ensure our new students are informed and confident about coming to high school next year.

COVID restrictions update: We can now hold small group instrumental music lessons inside and excitingly we have been given the "green light" to hold our planned Orientation day for Grade 6 students on Thursday 8<sup>th</sup> December.

On Wednesday, we had a Department of Education Audit of our measures to be COVID-safe, which we comfortably passed.

Like the majority of schools in Victoria, private and public, we have some asbestos in our school, but it is all considered 'safe' as we have no A1 or A2, high rated risk, asbestos. The Victorian Government has a policy and plan for removing *all* asbestos containing materials in schools. Therefore, on Friday next week (27<sup>th</sup> November), from 4:30pm and over the weekend, licenced contractors will safely remove all A3 asbestos from the College and Community Centre. Nobody is permitted onsite during this period. Air quality is monitored throughout the removal and a clearance certificate will be issued by an occupational hygienist before we resume operations on Monday 30<sup>th</sup> November.

A side benefit of this work is that a couple areas of the College will get a face-lift.

## YEAR 11 EXAMS

Year 11 students and accelerating Year 10 students have been busy this week doing their exams and I commend them on their preparation and how they have conducted themselves during the exam period. They sat a three-hour English exam on Wednesday morning, which is a long time, but is great practice for what they will face next year.

## HEADSTART

Students studying Year 12 subjects next year have begun their Year 12 courses during our Headstart Program this week. Students will finish on Friday, 27<sup>th</sup> November. I encourage all students to ask lots of questions of their Year 12 teachers, and prepare a holiday homework timetable in order to complete their work in an efficient and stress-free way. It is important that students don't leave this work until the end of holidays, as this creates a lot of stress for them. Some students keep working after Headstart and take the opportunity to work at school to get most of their work completed over a one or two week period. It also allows to students to seek help of teachers. I am very happy to work with students on organising their time to assist with achieving their goals in a stress-free way. I would love any student to have a chat to me about this.

Students currently in Year 10 will begin their Year 11 Headstart on Monday 30<sup>th</sup> November, finishing on Friday, 4<sup>th</sup> December. This will be an exciting time for them, beginning their VCE/VCAL two year pathway. I will be speaking with the students during this time about the ins and outs of Senior school, the study requirements, differences from Year 10, organisation of time, and more. I strongly encourage all students to use their time well during Headstart and ensure that they have made good decisions with their choice of subjects. I am very happy to speak to any students if they have questions or concerns

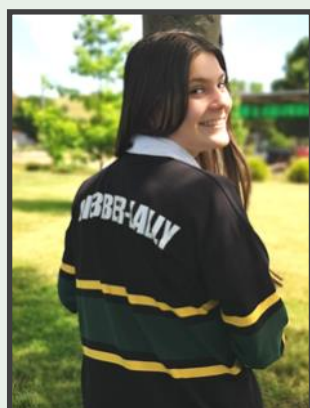

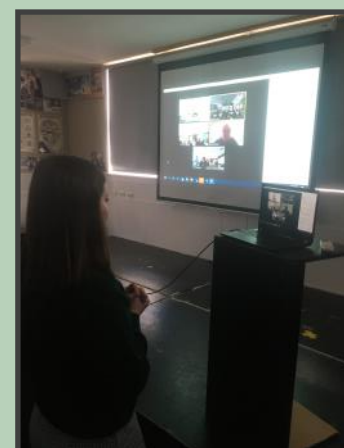

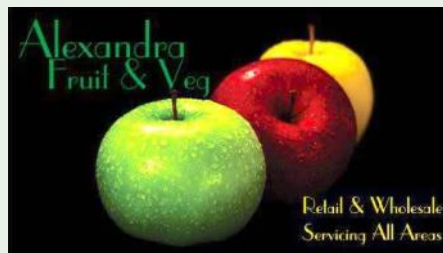

## Face masks

### What you can and cannot wear

Accessible



A fitted mask needs to be worn covering both your nose and mouth.



You can wear a face shield with a fitted face mask.



A fitted snood, Buff® or gaiter can be worn covering both your nose and mouth.

There are two types of face masks you can wear: cloth masks and surgical masks.

- Cloth masks are made of washable fabric and can be washed and re-used.
- Surgical masks are single-use masks and cannot be washed or re-used.



You cannot wear a bandana or scarf on its own.



You cannot wear a face shield on its own.



You cannot wear a loose snood, Buff® or gaiter on its own.

- A face mask is always recommended. The Chief Health Officer recommends a mask with three layers that fits securely around the face, specifically covering the nose and the mouth.
- However, a fitted snood, fitted buff or fitted gaiter is allowed.
- The emphasis is on fitted.
- In this instance fitted means the snood, buff or gaiter can extend in a fitted form to snugly fit over and cover your nose and mouth. It must be secure around your neck and lower face with no gaps along the nose ridge or the top of the garment. This is designed to protect you from coronavirus. It must be a sufficient face covering for this purpose.

A loose-fitting snood, buff or gaiter or scarf or bandana is not allowed.
