



Principals Report

It was our Year 11s last day today. They have finished their "Year 12 Head Start" classes for next year and head off to well-deserved holidays with a solid amount of homework. Our Year 11s are welcome to come into school in these last few weeks to work on their homework.

We are planning to run our usual activities program in the last week of school. We are waiting to get confirmation from a couple of venues: Bounce and Ice Skating at Docklands. Today, students were invited to sign up for Funfields in Whittlesea. There will also be a day of shopping at Knox. We will publish further details to students and families once we have them.

We had some major changes in our Covid restrictions in schools yesterday:

- Limitations on who can visit school premises no longer applies. This means parents can be welcomed back on site, for example for school drop-offs and pick-ups.
- Non-essential visitors, such as guest speakers and incursion leaders, are now allowed to attend school on site, subject to gathering limits.
- School tours are permitted.
- Students can drink from drinking fountains again.
- School assemblies can now occur at full capacity if they are exclusively attended by students and staff.
- Subject to public gathering limits, parents can also now attend student ceremonies. Large gatherings on school site involving external guests are subject to gathering limits for ceremonies; total venue cap (including students, staff and visitors) of 150 indoors or 300 outdoors.

Some things are still the same:

- Secondary school students and staff must wear a facemask while indoors at school and while travelling on school buses.
- Cleaning of high touch points continues throughout the day.
- Hand sanitiser is used on entry to rooms.
- If students are sick or have Covid like symptoms, they need to stay home and medical advice should be sought.

We have decided not to hold our "Presentation Night" this year, due to the cap on numbers indoors and the late release of VCE results, which is 30th December. Instead, we will hold a special assembly at the beginning of next year, hoping that allowed indoor numbers increase enabling parents to be invited.

Don't forget Immunisations on Monday

The second round of Year 7 school immunisations are being conducted at school on
Monday 30 November 2020.

The following vaccines will be offered on this day:

YEAR LEVEL	VACCINES OFFERED
YEAR 7 MALE & FEMALE STUDENTS	GARDASIL9 (HPV) DOSE 2 FINAL DOSE
CATCH UP YEAR 10 MALE & FEMALE STUDENTS (Who have previously returned a consent card)	MENINGOCOCCAL ACWY – ONE DOSE ONLY

These vaccinations are funded as part of the Victorian Secondary Schools Immunisation Program. Should your child miss out on starting their vaccination course this year they will may be eligible to receive them for free in subsequent years in the school program.

Consent cards should have already been signed and completed for these vaccinations earlier this year.

Please ensure that your child is wearing their sports uniform or a short sleeve shirt on the vaccination day (without any long sleeved layers underneath), this will enable a smooth vaccination process.

If your Year 7 child missed the first dose of vaccines please contact council's immunisation team on 1800 655 360 to obtain a consent card (if consent card previously not returned). Council can administer the first dose of vaccines at school if we have a signed consent card. To complete the vaccine course, students must attend a council immunisation session/ local Maternal and Child Health Centre or their GP, 6 months after dose 1 was given.

Year 10 students who have NOT returned a Meningococcal ACWY consent card may receive this vaccine free at the local Maternal and Child Health Centre or their GP.

If your child has been vaccinated elsewhere and you have not already done so, please notify council's immunisation team on 1800 655 360.

If you DO NOT wish for your child to receive any further vaccinations or if you have any enquiries about the program or your child's vaccinations, please contact Wodonga Council's Immunisation Team on 1800 655 360.






WOODSTOCK SESSIONS





If you're a jobseeker aged between 17 and 29, you may be eligible to apply.

The Youth Employment Program can give you valuable on-the-job experience and training that can lead to long-term career.

The public service is a dynamic and diverse workplace that supports our community.

What kind of jobs are available?

The Youth Employment Program offers 6-12 month roles in Victorian government departments and agencies. Types of jobs include:

Training, support and development

Face masks

What you can and cannot wear


Accessible



A fitted mask needs to be worn covering both your nose and mouth.



You can wear a face shield with a fitted face mask.




A fitted snood, Buff® or gaiter can be worn covering both your nose and mouth.

There are two types of face masks you can wear: cloth masks and surgical masks.

- Cloth masks are made of washable fabric and can be washed and re-used.
- Surgical masks are single-use masks and cannot be washed or re-used.



You cannot wear a bandana or scarf on its own.



You cannot wear a face shield on its own.



You cannot wear a loose snood, Buff® or gaiter on its own.

- A face mask is always recommended. The Chief Health Officer recommends a mask with three layers that fits securely around the face, specifically covering the nose and the mouth.
- However, a fitted snood, fitted buff or fitted gaiter is allowed.
- The emphasis is on fitted.
- In this instance fitted means the snood, buff or gaiter can extend in a fitted form to snugly fit over and cover your nose and mouth. It must be secure around your neck and lower face with no gaps along the nose ridge or the top of the garment. This is designed to protect you from coronavirus. It must be a sufficient face covering for this purpose.

A loose-fitting snood, buff or gaiter or scarf or bandana is not allowed.
