Principals' Report





AUTOWELD help the local scout group.

Several years ago the Alexandra Scouts brought 8 old canoes and a frame from OEG. The frame was designed to fit into a high sided tandem trailer to carry rafts.

Two years ago, an old 13ft caravan chassis was given to Alexandra Skips to remove from a farm at Buxton. Simon Goodman asked Autoweld if the chassis was of any use for the class to make something with it.

And so the two came together.

The wooden floor of the caravan was removed to reveal sections of steel in the walking areas. There was no need to strengthen the floor where the beds and kitchen benches had been. The water tank, fold out step and remains of the gas bottle holders were removed. A team of students got to work with the plasma cutter and off cuts of sheet metal, patching the sections of missing floor so that we could now freely walk inside it whilst loading canoes. Other students made a pair of mudguards. The big OEG raft frame was lowered onto the modified chassis. The frame was widened by 80mm so a fifth canoe could fit on the top and bottom row.

The frame was welded to the chassis and the front and back of the chassis was extended by 270mm so the trailer floor became the length of the canoe. Then the students made taillight holders, numberplate holders, mesh boxes, rear box for the paddles and front boxes for the life jackets. Mounts were made for the front and side clearance lights. A jockey wheel mount and spare wheel mount was made completeing the welding side to the project.

The trailer was sprayed, two new tyres fitted, new wiring and LED lights fitted. New brake shoes and the bearings regreased and Autoweld's job was complete.

The trailer was weighed and registered and is ready to use.

PATHWAYS AND CAREER OPPORTUNITIES

Can your business support students with their Industry placements?

ASC students are required to engage in industry placement to learn about the world of work and employers' expectations.

Our Victorian Curriculum of Applied Learning (VCAL) students (in years 11 and 12) are required to undertake a Structured Workplace Learning (SWL) requirement every Wednesday, for a maximum of 20 days with any one employer.

Applications for the CSEF program for 2021 are now open.

The Camps, Sports and Excursions Fund (CSEF) payment arrangements are now open.
