Course Selection 2022

As mentioned in last weeks Inside Out, we will run a “Speed-dating” format for Subject Information on Monday the 2nd of August in the Hall for a double period with each year level. Students will watch a PowerPoint presentation while I talk to them about their 2022 course and the differences in what was open to them in this current year. It will also cover future pathways/careers Information and how to fill out their selection form. Students will then break up into small groups and have 10 minutes with each Subject Learning Area so they can ask questions and find out more about subjects.

As we are unable to conduct the Open Night, virtual Q and A sessions will be held via Zoom. These Q and A sessions provide parents with the opportunity to ask any questions about course selection and subject learning areas.
