Students will be able to identify features of different text types. Students will be able to write blogs, movie reviews and informative pieces. Students will understand that effect that the audience has on the tone and type of language used in a text. Students will be able to write letters to friends and newspaper articles. Students will understand a range of persuasive techniques used to persuade the audience. Students will be able to identify persuasive techniques in written and spoken arguments. Students will be able to analyse how persuasive language impacts the reader and how effective an argument is. <p>Assessment</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> Students will be able to complete a short answer analysis of an argument. Students will be able to write a response to an argument, putting forward a reasoned point of view.
10	The analysis and construction of argument – Oral Presentation	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> Students will form an educated point of view on an issue with the intention of persuading others. Students will investigate and research arguments for and against a chosen issue. Students will find evidence to support their point of view.
