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Pathway Options


Two main educational pathways:

• VCE (Victorian Certificate of Education)

VCE (Vocational Major).

• They are BOTH two-year certificates.







Why Finish School?

- Completing Year 12 sets you up for lifelong learning.
- It helps you prepare for the opportunities of career changes throughout your life.
- Higher levels of education tend to lead to higher paying jobs.
- Minimum age of 17 to be approved to leave school.



Education for Future Success

- Nearly 80% of students leaving Year 12 go on to further study at TAFE or university immediately from school.
- More will enrol to study in subsequent years.
- It is projected that more than 9 in 10 jobs will require post-school qualifications university or TAFE.





VCE - An overview

- VCE = Victorian Certificate of Education
- Every unit studied is a semester unit (half year)
- Typically, Units 1 & 2 in Year 11, and Units 3 & 4 in Year 12



VCE - An overview

- Some Year 11 students do one Unit 3, 4 study in Year 11.
- Undertaking VCE keeps every educational pathway open – University, TAFE, Apprenticeships, Traineeships and Employment



Passing VCE

Successfully complete 16 units of study which must include :


- 3 units of English
- 3 sequences of Units 3 & 4 subjects (Year 12 subjects)

On passing VCE, you will receive an ATAR score (Australian Tertiary Admissions Ranking).

Universities use the ATAR to help determine entry into their courses.

Other courses may require presentation of a folio, an interview, audition or a profile form.

VCE Vocational Major - an overview

- A two-year certificate.
- Can comprise of a mix of VET and VCE subjects.
- Compulsory subjects: Literacy, Mathematics, Vocational Major subject including Work-related skills and Personal development skills, and at least one VET subject.
- One day of work placement per week.
- Achieved through journals, projects, workplace reports, logbooks, certificates, assignments.
- No ATAR score.



- Opportunity to do a School-based apprenticeship. You must see Philip S before end of August.
- Works best for students who have an idea of an industry they would like to study.
- For your Workplace learning: start to develop of a list of potential employers. There is a maximum of 20 weeks with one employer (minimum of 4 over the 2 years).
- Gain credit from your Work Placement.



Vocational Major - an overview

• Workplace skills unit: How to conduct yourself in the workplace, OHS, interviews, resumes, the employer's perspective.

 Personal Development skills unit: strengths, identifying areas for improvement, working with community groups and local employers e.g. Embassy of Ideas, composting project, local cafes.

Completing your online Selection Form

You will receive a **web-code** in the next couple of weeks which you will use to do your selections online.

To prepare for submitting your course, use this sheet today and over our selection period to write down your ideas for your selections.

Select your VCE pathway: Either VCE or VCE Vocational Major.

If VCE:

• In the drop-down box, select English 1,2 (compulsory).

Now select 5 more subjects in order of preference (1 being your most preferred). If you have accelerated this year then make sure you put down your Unit 3,4 subject.

In the Reserve Preference drop down box you must select two more subjects. These
are just in case you have a clash of subjects, or a subject is not running.

If VCE Vocational Major:

- In the dropdown box select the subject Vocational Major 1,2 (compulsory).
- Select your English (Literacy or VCE English).
- Select your Mathematics (General or Foundation)
- Select a VET subject.
- Select, in order of preference, two more subjects these can be a VCE or VET subject.
- In the Reserve Preference drop down box, select ONE more preference. This is in case you have a clash of subjects, or a subject does not run.

You will submit your course preferences online by hitting the SUBMIT button. It will then give you the instruction to PRINT a copy and get your Parent/Guardian signature. You need to hand this form in to the Office.
