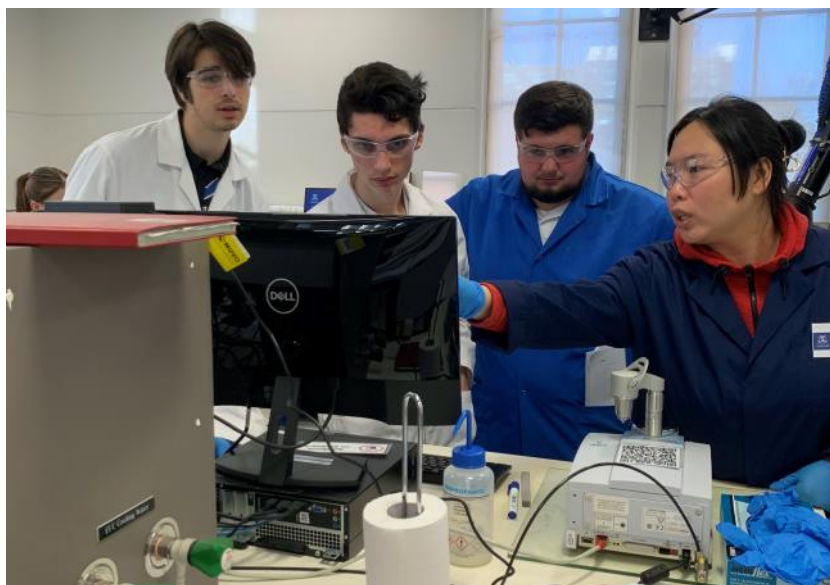




## Year 11 & 12 Chemistry Excursion.
