Student Scholarships

The Department of Education administers a range of scholarships on behalf of various trusts.

Scholarships are available to students currently enrolled in Grade 4 to Year 11 in 2023 and students enrolled in Year 12 in 2023 who plan on undertaking tertiary studies in 2024.

Applicants for the scholarships are evaluated on their:

- · academic achievement
- · participation in school activities
- · community involvement.



Scholarships are either one-off payments or available for the duration of the student's course/study, and support students and families to assist with the cost of education and engagement in further study at primary, secondary and tertiary level.

Eligibility

Students must be enrolled in Victorian schools and must be Australian citizens or permanent residents. Some scholarships are available specifically to Victorian government school students while others are available to students across all sectors.

Scholarships may be targeted to students experiencing financial hardship, and trusts may have particular eligibility criteria.

<u>Can students apply for more than one scholarship?</u> Students are encouraged to carefully identify and apply for all scholarships where they meet the criteria.

<u>How much are the scholarships worth?</u> Grade 4 to Year 11 scholarships are one-off payments between \$300 and \$1,500. Some Year 12 scholarships are one-off payments while others are paid for the duration of the course and range from \$300 to \$10,000.

longer be accepting cash payments.


