

#### Principal's Report

Our swimming sports last Friday were a great occasion. The House Spirit was strong, as was the effort in the water. Thanks to Mrs Crouch and Mr Francis for organising the day and to the staff and parents who supported them in the smooth running of it. Congratulations to all students who participated and to Long for winning the day.

This is Bron Howell's last week of school before heading off on leave. Bron has been a great servant to the college as a teacher and a leader in the wellbeing space. We wish Bron well for the years ahead. Our students, staff and college are better off due to her outstanding contribution over the last 22 years. Thanks Bron, we will miss you.

Energy drinks and large bottles of soft drink are not appropriate at school due to the negative effect sugar and caffeine have on student health and are therefore confiscated if brought here. This is part of encouraging our students to make healthy choices.

We are happy for students to wear jewellery at school but it needs to be modest and appropriate to our formal setting. Senior staff will speak with

students and contact home if necessary, if we have concerns with a student's choice of jewellery.

Attendance at school obviously plays a big part in success at school. A student with a 90% attendance rate will miss one month of school for the year, which is a significant amount of learning time. We see an attendance rate above 90% as being critical for a student's success. We ask our students and families to be highly aware of this and to avoid any unnecessary absences from school. Due to the importance of good attendance, we highlight it regularly in the Principal's report and each term we award 100 points to the House with the best attendance, 60 to the 2nd best House and 40 to the third.



#### Japan Tour 2025

ASC offers a tour to Japan every second year for our students of Japanese.

Our next tour is scheduled to depart in 2025.

Students currently in Years 8, 9 or 10 are invited to express their interest in participating on our 2025 tour.

#### Tour details:

- The length of the tour is typically around 15 days.
- The tour departs on the weekend prior to the last week of Term 1 and extends to the end of the first week of the school holidays. Dates are yet to be confirmed but March 29 – April 12, 2025.
- The tour aims to further develop students' use of Japanese language and expand their knowledge and understanding of Japanese customs and culture.
- The tour is a backpacking tour. It is self-guided (no tour bus), with students learning to navigate the different Japanese public transport systems.
- Key cities visited include: Tokyo, Hiroshima, Kyoto, and Nara.

Activities include but are not limited to:

- Tokyo Disneyland, Hakone day trip (volcanic valley, onsen experience, lake cruise looking out at Mt Fuji), teamLab (digital art museum), Sumida River cruise, Asakusa market, Disneysea, cherry blossom viewing along the Path of Philosophy.
- Hiroshima Peace Park, A-Bomb Dome, Miyajima Island, Himeji Castle, Shukkeien Garden.
- Kyoto Ninja castle and ninjutsu show,
   Kiyomizudera (water temple), Kinkakuji (golden pavilion), Fushimi Inari (1,000 tori shrine),
   Jikokudani Monkey Park.












#### A Message from our Health and Physical Education Team


The Alexandra Secondary College Physical Education staff are keen to encourage all students to actively participate in regular physical activity.


The daily physical activity guidelines state all students of secondary school age should be participating in sixty minutes of moderate to vigorous activity on a daily basis.
