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

We will miss both greatly in our college and wish them well in retirement.


We are also thankful to Mookie, who came out of retirement to help us. She has done a fantastic job filling in for Kara Penhale, who has been on leave this semester.

Exploring the history of the Israel-Palestine conflict


To help understand the history of the current Israel-Palestine conflict, and to complement their studies of the Interwar years and World War Two, Year 10 Humanities students recently created historical timelines of power and conflict in the region surrounding and including current day Israel.


Shannon, Ryan and Stuart chose to identify shifts in power from 800BCE creating an approximately 4-metre

long timeline. Jorja and Makenna focussed on power shifts and conflict since the Balfour Declaration of 1917.



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Year 7 Goulburn Valley Water

Goulburn Valley Water visited our year 7's today to provide a presentation on water treatment. Students learnt about the chemicals and separation techniques used to produce our drinking water. Students also blind tasted some water and guessed whether the samples were bottled water or tap. This tied in nicely with our current Science topic, separating mixtures. Students were able to relate their learning to a relevant, real-world context. It was a great experience and we are thankful to Kristy from GV Water who came from Shepparton to present.





Levi Campbell - The GV water lady, Kristy showed us how tap water is cheaper and better than bottled water. You can get 33 bathtubs full of tap water for the price of \$3.90c or 1 bottle of Fiji water for \$3.90c.

Chase Hilder - On the 20th of July Kristy from Goulburn Valley Water visited ASC to inform us about water usage and how they clean our tap water. She took us throw a power point showing the separation of partials needed to be taken out to drink our water. Then we did a experiment learning about the cost of tap water compared to bottled water with incredible resalts. To conclude we learn a lot about water cleaning and the cost of water.

Charlotte Boulton - Kristy from Goulburn Valley Water came and talked to us about her job. She told us how they filter the dirt from the water so it is clean when it comes out of our taps. Kristy told us about how they put certain chemicals in the water to make the dirt particles stick together so they can filter them out more easily. My favourite part was when we got to try the 3 different types of water: school tap water, Coles' bottled water and Fiji water. We didn't know what came from where and we had to guess! To me, the water all tasted the same and I couldn't really tell the difference.

Cheyenne Richards - Kristy From Goulburn Valley Water, came down to teach us about what she does on a daily basis and the process that happens with the water that we all drink. Kristy Showed us how they get rid of the dirt from the water to make it all clean by using certain chemicals. We got to try and decide which water was which out of 3 different water suppliers. That was my favourite part of The Incursion. We tried School water, Coles' bottled water and Fiji water which didn't taste good to me, but it was fun to see the difference. Kristy had prepared a slideshow for us which had all the information step by step on what they do at Goulburn Valley Water. She had also brought in a filtering process that they use that contained carbon, sand, and gravel.

Eadie Gibson - I liked how she told us about the levels of filtration and all the different techniques used to get rid of bacteria.
