Our Year 8s, 11s and 12s and Weinberg are leading the way with attendance.



General details about the SSL program and the application process will be emailed to all students and their families in the coming weeks.


In short, students will be asked to express a formal interest in being a part of this programme in Term Four. Interested students may subsequently be invited to





What 'Wear it Purple' day means to them.




'Wear it Purple' day is a day we celebrate at school that celebrates inclusivity. We have a free dress day, share food together and enjoy music. It is a great day.



Semester 2 Parent Teacher Interviews

As with last Semesters Parent Teacher Interviews, we will be offering a combination of both online and in-school interviews.

Interviews will take place Wednesday 11th of September. This will be a pupil free day.

Online interviews will run between 11am and 3pm. These interviews will be 10 minutes in length.

In person interviews will take place at school in the 'John Taylor Science Building' between 3.30pm and 7pm.

Bookings go live on Sentral Friday 30th August at 5pm.

Part 1: Making a booking for an interview

Please note that:

- Sentral will not allow you to double book appointment times
- You will have the capability to cancel a booking and select a new booking time if the original time no longer suits you
- Options exist to print the screen showing all interview times, or alternatively to export to iCal
- Sentral will automatically email you a copy of your confirmed interview times
- If you have downloaded the Sentral app, please note that interviews will only appear in Portal 1 and not in Portal 2. This is likely to apply to only a small number of parents
- 1. Log in to Sentral
- 2. Click on the green 'Interviews' tab at the top of screen. This will only appear when interviews are live. Please note that instructions will appear on the screen to guide you.



All your children's names and those of all their teachers will appear on the one screen. Simply click on the drop-down box to secure a time.



You will have two sections, and options for meetings.

One section will be called **2024 Parent Teacher online interviews.** This is where you will select your **online interview** options between **11am and 3pm.**

Below those appointment options you will have **2024 Parent Teacher in person interviews** located on site in the 'John Taylor Science Building', between **3.30pm and 7.00pm**



Once you have booked an interview on Sentral according to the instructions above, you will see a meeting link. There will be a different link provided for each interview. The links will be sent to you in an email confirmation. On the night, you just click on 'join' to open the meeting link.




Click: 'Join on the web' if provided with that option or type the following into your web browser: https://www.microsoft.com/en-au/microsoft-teams/join-a-meeting?rtc=1

Add your Meeting ID and Password and click on 'Join a meeting.'




You can open the meeting in the Microsoft Teams App if you have it; however, our preference is for you to join online as a Guest. See below.

Click 'Cancel' on the pop-up and then click 'Continue on this browser.'







If you are not already signed into a Microsoft Teams account, this will allow you to put in a guest name. IMPORTANT: Please type the name of the student/your child rather than your own name. This will assist the teacher to quickly identify your presence in the waiting room and grant you permission to join the interview.



You will enter a waiting room until such time as the teacher accepts you into the meeting, teacher may be finishing a previous meeting, or you may be early. This is a good time to double check you have connected at the appropriate interview time.



Once you have joined the meeting you will have the option to turn on/ off the camera and microphone and leave the meeting after the 5-minute interview period has finished.







Wear it Purple was founded in 2010 in response to several rainbow young people taking their own lives following bullying and harassment resulting from the lack of acceptance of their sexuality or gender identity.

Wear it Purple was established to show young people across the globe that there is hope, that there

are people who support and accept them, and that they have the right to be proud of who they are.

Diversity isn't just about pride, it includes race, culture, religion and different abilities. Wear It Purple day is about accepting and being welcoming to people who are different to you. You don't have to share the same beliefs as others, but you can choose to make a fellow students feel safe, included and welcomed.

This Wear It Purple day we ask all students to come in free dress and wear something purple, if you don't have anything purple wear a bright colour.

A gold coin donation is requested, money raised will go to Headspace, a mental health service that supports all young people.


