Please find below Alexandra Secondary College's voluntary financial contributions schedule for 2022, which includes an overview of what your contributions will contribute towards.

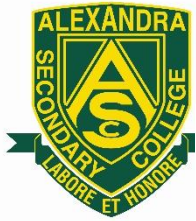

FREE INSTRUCTION
